

**Appendix II as referred to in paragraph 2 of Article 15 of Annex 2 to the Protocol
between the Republic of Peru and the Kingdom of Thailand
to Accelerate the Liberalization of Trade in Goods and Trade Facilitation
Minimal Information
Certificate of Origin**

Subject to the provisions of paragraph 2 of Article 15, a Certificate of Origin shall include the following minimal information:

1. Name and legal address (including city and country) of the exporter;
2. Name and legal address (including city and country) of the producer, if known;
3. Name and legal address (including city and country) of the importer, if known;
4. Description of the good(s) for which preferential tariff treatment is claimed, which shall contain sufficient details to relate it to the invoice description and the relevant code(s) under the Harmonized System nomenclature;
5. Harmonized System classification at the six digit level for the good(s) for which preferential tariff treatment is claimed;
6. Quantity, gross weight and value (FOB) of the goods(s);
7. Number and date of invoice;
8. Country of origin of the good(s);
9. Origin criteria satisfied by the good(s) in accordance with Annex 2. If the good satisfies a specific rule of origin, the rule regarding change in tariff classification, regional value content requirement or other applicable requirements shall be specified.

The origin criteria shall be specified as follows:

- a. Wholly Obtained: WO; indicating the corresponding subparagraph of Article 3 of Annex 2.
 - b. Specific Rule of Origin: PS; indicating one or a combination of the following:
 - i. Change from any other subheading: CTSH
 - ii. Change from any other heading: CTH
 - iii. Change from any other chapter: CC
 - iv. Regional Value Content: RVC
 - v. Chapter Note: Note
 - vi. Technical Requirement: TR
 - c. Exclusively from originating materials: EO
 - d. Set or Assortment: Set;
10. Name of the officer designated by the certifying entity who signs the Certificate of Origin;
 11. Date on which the Certificate of Origin was signed by the designated officer;



12. Observations indicating any exceptional cases as provided for in Article 15(9) of Annex 2;
13. Declaration Statement where the designated officer certifies that the details and statements provided by the exporter in the Certificate of Origin are correct. The declaration shall include the handwritten signature of the designated officer and the seal of the certifying entity;
14. Declaration by the exporter who requests the Certificate of Origin that the good(s) covered in the Certificate of Origin meets the rules of origin in accordance with Annex 2. The declaration shall include the handwritten signature of the exporter.
