Dear Minister Pehin Dato Lim Jock Seng,

In connection with the signing on this date of the Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement (the "TPP Agreement"), I have the honour to confirm the following understanding reached between the Government of Brunei Darussalam and the Government of the Republic of Peru during the course of negotiations on the TPP Agreement:

Subject to domestic law, in a manner that is consistent with the Agreement on Trade Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (the "TRIPS Agreement"), the Government of the Republic of Peru and the Government of Brunei Darussalam confirm that geographical indications for wines and spirits from each Party will be protected in the other Party.

Consistent with the previous paragraph, the Government of Brunei Darussalam confirms that it will provide the legal means to protect the geographical indication "Pisco" only to the extent permitted by, and according to the provisions set out in, its law.

I have the honour to propose that this letter and your letter in reply confirming this understanding constitute an understanding between the Government of the Republic of Peru and the Government of Brunei Darussalam, which will come into effect on the date on which the TPP Agreement enters into force for both Brunei Darussalam and the Republic of Peru.

The English and Spanish texts of this agreement are equally authentic. In the event of any divergence between those texts, the English text shall prevail.
